Roving Reporter

EULAR provides young researchers with the opportunity to access a variety of courses, including online, standard and scientifically endorsed courses

With so many training opportunities available it can be difficult to know which ones best suit you and your needs. For that reason, the EMEUNET Education subgroup are looking for volunteer 'Roving Reporters' to give us their opinions on recently attended EULAR courses.

What is a Roving Reporter?

A Roving Reporter is someone who volunteers to write a brief report about the EULAR course they have attended.

What would I have to do?

We ask that you send us a short report (≤ 500 words) on your experience of the EULAR course you attend within 1 month of it finishing. Please enclose a photo of yourself with your report. We will publish your report and photo online and include it in the next available EMEUNET newsletter.

What would I have to discuss?

We would like you to report your own experiences of the course, so you are welcome to write in whatever style you want. However, there are a number of topics we would like you to consider discussing:

- What job/role do you have and what was your level of experience in the topic before the course?
- What level was the course (beginner, intermediate, advanced) and was it as advertised?
- What were your reasons for attending the course and did it meet your learning objectives?
- Was the course delivered as a lecture format, or was it more of a 'hands on' format?
- Practicalities of attending the course (facilities, transport links, bursaries available?)
- On balance, if the course represents value for money?
